Writing Prompt:

In his interview, Carl Phillips argues, "the functions [of the love poem] remain the same—to avow, to lament, to petition, to negotiate, to navigate." For this writing assignment, draft a love poem that fulfills one or more of Carl Phillips's definitions.

In addition, we will ask you to work with several constraints:

- 1. The poem should be sixteen lines long.
- 2. The poem should include at least three questions.
- 3. The poem should include at least one sentence of direct address.
- 4. The poem must include one sentence that stretches over four lines.
- 5. The poem must use three nouns that appear in "As from a Quiver of Arrows" by Carl Phillips.
